Focus on Rehabilitation



A place of safety, healing and hope at LAMB

In the heart of LAMB, just behind the hospital, is the Rehabilitation centre. It is a place of safety, healing and hope. LAMB Rehab helps disabled children to know the acceptance of society and the love of Christ. The staff team provide medical support, nutrition and rehabilitation without which the children and mothers may be outcast from their own community. The centre only has 8 beds, and those fortunate enough to be admitted get treatment plans, assistive devices and education. For those who return home and for those not able to come to the centre, there are 26 community clinics and together they support 1628 children. The project started 29 years ago and is a centre of

Fistula surgery update

The number of women coming to LAMB with obstetric fistula sadly has not dropped over the last 10 years. We are still finding women who are suffering for many years. Often fistula surgery is very complex and we very much appreciate the regular surgical support of Professor Dr. Sayeba Akhter from Dhaka during our fistula camps. While the number of new fistulas has gone down thanks to better obstetric care, we are seeing an increasing number caused by low-quality surgery from other hospitals, mostly hysterectomies, sometimes Caesarian sections. This year we are very proud that around half of our fistula surgeries have been done by our national surgeons. Fistula surgery at LAMB continues to be a life-changing form of treatment we are able to offer, for which we thank God.



Hospital numbers are back to pre-Covid levels

In the last year, inpatient admissions were **7,497**; and outpatient numbers were **54,366** which is **7% (3,625)** higher than last year.
